IN BLESSED REPOSE With sadness at the loss, but with profound gratitude for a long and productive life of pastoral ministry, we announce the unexpected falling asleep in the Lord of **His Eminence JOB, Archbishop of Chicago and the Midwest**, on Friday, December 18. His Eminence was on his way back to Chicago from a deanery meeting in Cleveland when he was found unconscious behind the wheel of his car in a hotel parking garage. He was rushed by paramedics to the hospital, where he was pronounced dead shortly after he arrived, succumbing to walking pneumonia. In his years as ruling hierarch of the *Diocese of the Midwest*, JOB witnessed tremendous growth through the establishment of many new mission parishes. He was also an accomplished iconographer, iconologist and liturgical composer and had an extraordinary affinity with Orthodox youth that gained him church-wide recognition. We thank God for all the marvelous things accomplished by His Eminence during his 63 years on earth. He certainly filled his life in the best way, enriching the flock entrusted to his care and working tirelessly for the *Orthodox Church in America*. May his memory be eternal—Vechnaya Pamyat!

Please remember that the Eve of the Nativity (December 24) is a day of **strict fast**. From December 25 through January 4, there is **NO** fasting or kneeling in celebration of the Birth of our Lord.



The season of **ADVENT** is coming to an end. Soon, fasting will be replaced by feasting. In these final days before Christmas, try not to lose sight of the reason for this penitential period: to prepare to greet the Son of God in the flesh. Through the repeated observance of Christ's birth, we are reminded that we are the children of God and that Jesus became one of us when He deigned to be born of the Virgin. His Incarnation was the dawn of salvation. Everyone who keeps this true meaning of Christmas alive in their hearts will have a fuller and happier life and will, indeed, attain eternal salvation.

Please remember that, as Orthodox Christians, our celebration of this great feast starts in church, both on the eve and the day; all worldly or secular activities associated with this holiday should take place afterwards. Perhaps the following verse from the Christmas Canon best describes how we should observe the Nativity of Christ: "Let us keep the feast not popularly, but in a holy way; not as worldly folk, but as otherworldly; not as our affair, but as His—our Lord's; not to bring sickness, but to bring healing; not through the birth, but through the new birth."

May you all have a blessed holiday and a season filled with love, joy, faith, light, hope, courage, peace and goodwill.
