When one is ill, it can, very often, be a time when one feels alone and isolated. The **Sacrament of Holy Unction (Anointing of the Sick)** reminds us that when we are in pain—be it physical, emotional and/or spiritual—Christ is present with us through the ministry of His Church. He is among us to offer strength to meet the challenges of life. As is the custom of our parish during Great Lent, this sacrament will be celebrated this year on **Thursday, March 18**, at 7 p.m. After the reading of seven Epistles and Gospels and the offering of seven prayers all devoted to healing, everyone present will be anointed with oil, as a sign of God's mercy and forgiveness. Holy Unction is not an obligatory, but voluntary sacrament. It is very good, though, for all Orthodox Christians who are sick in body, mind or spirit to draw near, as it can provide great comfort, spiritual uplifting and the patience to accept the will of the Lord. So, keep the day open and plan to attend. (*NOTE: Those who are not regular communicants must prepare to receive Holy Unction by first going to Holy Confession. If you have any questions, contact Fr. David.*)
