**CELEBRATING PENTECOST** The great feast of Pentecost is **next Sunday**. There are several beautiful customs associated with this holiday, known by many as *Green Sunday*. The interior and exterior of churches and homes are decorated with flowers and branches of green leaves or green plants. Green vestments are worn by the priest and altar servers and it is customary for those present at the liturgical services throughout the week to also wear green clothing. The color is considered a symbol of the new divine life and gifts brought to us by the Holy Spirit, for without His presence in our lives, we are spiritually dead. You are, therefore, encouraged to welcome the Holy Spirit, both inwardly and outwardly, by participating in these traditions.
