**Tomorrow**, all Orthodox Christians will enter into the period of increased spiritual labor commonly known as the **Apostles** (**Peter & Paul**) **Fast**. For 57 days, we have rejoiced in celebrating the feasts of the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ and the Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Now, we once again enter into a grace-filled time of preparation for the Feast of SS. Peter & Paul, our parish patrons. During this period, we are called to walk in the footsteps of the Apostles who, after receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit, began a fast with prayer to ask God to strengthen their resolve in carrying the Gospel to the ends of the earth.

Because of an early celebration of Pascha this year, the Fast is 29 days long. Whether lengthy or short, this is a period that, unfortunately, is often neglected by the faithful. You are strongly encouraged not to dismiss this time of prayer, abstinence and good works. Use the next four weeks so as, St. Leo the Great says, "not to be conquered by any lusts nor held in possession by any vices in order that the habitation of the Holy Spirit may be stained with no pollution."

Let us all embark on the Fast with the feeling of the newly-descended Holy Spirit, seeking to emulate the devotion to the Church that the Apostles, especially SS. Peter & Paul, were willing to give, even through trials, hard work and suffering.



**Memorial Day** is not just a day off, a three-day weekend or the unofficial start of summer. It is a day on which we stop to remember not only the men and women who died in military service while fighting to defend the cause of freedom, but to honor those who were left behind...spouses who lost husbands and wives...sons and daughters who lost parents. It is about remembering the tremendous sacrifices paid by **all**!

We are blessed to enjoy a lot of freedoms in our country: the right to worship as we please, to work and live where we want and to pursue prosperity and happiness. Most of these freedoms we take for granted. This day we are called to celebrate the courageous men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice for the privileges we have. Let us, therefore, remember to stop and thank the Lord for those who gave us a democratic republic, freedom of the seas and protection against pirates; they preserved the Union and ended slavery and they saved democracy for ourselves and for others. Let us, also, pray for a world of peace and mutual understanding, so that we may no longer have to resolve petty resentments and grudges with bloodshed.

We should not forget. God does not forget either those who are lost or those who remain. He cares for both and through Him, so should we.

## SYNOPSIS OF APR 19, 2010 PARISH COUNCIL MEETING №

- MRS Landscaping accepted the proposed \$13,000 cemetery maintenance contract for 10 months, with the provision that both a spring and fall clean-up at the rectory and church be included.
- The tree that fell down at the cemetery as a result of the torrential rainstorm on March 13 was not completely cut; consequently, payment will be withheld until the job is completed.
- > Per communication with Borough Councilman John Krenzel, our parish will not be paying an electric surcharge effective July 1.
- On behalf of Council, James Jones will be sending a *Thank You* note to the neighbor who snowblowed the rectory sidewalk this past winter.
- Excess dirt in the new section of the cemetery was leveled.
- Excellent feedback was provided on the *Community Service Worker Program* being spearheaded by Jay Pelleriti.
- Because of several omissions made over the past two years, Council will look into possibly acquiring a new vendor to supply our weekly offering envelopes.

Saturday, June 19 is the date that has been set for the 15<sup>th</sup> Annual Run/Walk for the Church. This fundraiser will benefit not only our parish here in South River, but also Christ the Saviour Church in Paramus and Annunciation Church in Brick. Parishioners of all ages are encouraged to take part in this fun and fellowship-building day. We've had a great time in the past and are looking forward to an even better one this time!

This year's family-friendly trek will begin around 11:30 a.m. and again start and finish in South River. The distance will be about nine miles for runners and five miles for walkers.
