This Saturday, June 19 is the date that has been set for the ***15th Annual Run/Walk for the Church***. This fundraiser will benefit not only our parish here in South River, but also Christ the Saviour Church in Paramus and Annunciation Church in Brick. Parishioners of all ages are encouraged to take part in this fun and fellowship-building day. We've had a great time in the past and are looking forward to an even better one this time!

This year's family-friendly trek will begin around 11:30 a.m. and again start and finish in South River. The distance will be about nine miles for runners and five miles for walkers. Water stands and "route marshals" will be stationed at various spots throughout the neighborhoods to offer direction and assistance. As in prior years, each participant will wear a special T-shirt commemorating the day and after the last person crosses the finish line, everyone will be invited to gather in the church hall for some refreshments.

You can take part in this event by joining as a runner or walker, pledging a certain amount for each mile, giving a set donation or offering a monetary contribution towards the purchase of bottled water and provisions for the post run/walk get-together.
