IF YOU ARE GOING TO BE ADMITTED TO THE HOSPITAL OR MOVING TO A NURSING FACILITY, please call Fr. David to let him know or have a family member inform him so he can make a pastoral visit. Because of privacy laws, hospitals and nursing homes can no longer notify Father of your attendance without your consent.

THE DIOCESAN COUNCIL met last month at *Assumption of the Holy Virgin Church* in Clifton, after which the following pronouncements were issued:

- A **Spiritual Court** was re-constituted by His Grace, Bishop MICHAEL, following the direction of the Apostle Paul that "all things be done decently and in good order" in the Church and consistent with the Statute of the OCA.
- A Diocesan Council of Presbyters was established to advise His Grace on matters pertaining to the life, growth and development of the Diocese.
- ➤ In a concerted effort to facilitate, improve and expand communications at all diocesan levels (bishop, deaneries, clergy and parishes), Bishop MICHAEL created the position of **Diocesan Director of Communications** and appointed Archpriest Ken James Stavrevsky to serve in this role.
- ➤ It was the expressed feeling of Council members that financially delinquent parishes must begin submitting their assessments and achieve an "up-to-date" status now that we have a new diocesan hierarch.
- ➤ His Grace again appealed to all the parishes, clergy and laity of the Diocese to give full and generous support to *St. Andrew's Camp* in Jewell, NY, as an important resource for ministering to our youth. He plans to visit and reside at the camp between parish visitations, services and administrative meetings.
- The process of moving Bishop MICHAEL and the diocesan offices to the chancery in Bronxville, NY will occur in June, after His Grace fulfills and concludes his responsibilities as the Dean of *St. Tikhon's Seminary*.
- ➤ His Grace was tasked by the *Holy Synod of Bishops* with reviewing the current mode and methods of financial support (assessments) in the OCA and developing a more scriptural approach of stewardship, as it relates to financial resources provided from parishes to the diocese and from the dioceses to the OCA.
- > The student community of *St. Tikhon's Seminary* donated \$1,000 toward the newly-established **Diocese of New York & New Jersey Relief Fund**, which was initiated by Bishop MICHAEL at his consecration banquet to assist financially struggling parishes with salary subsidies for their priests.
- The Cathedral of the Holy Virgin Protection in New York City was asked and has agreed to host the Annual Diocesan Assembly on Tuesday, November 9.

★ SYNOPSIS OF MAY 17, 2010 PARISH COUNCIL MEETING ★

- ➤ The Junior R Club and Church School will be redecorating one of the upstairs rooms in the hall to become a new community room/library.
- The informal meeting of parish organizations held at the rectory on May 11 was well received. Better communication between the groups was discussed.
- ➤ Immediate maintenance projects to be addressed in the church hall include servicing of the refrigerator, repairing of the ceiling/roof in the kitchen and replacing lights in the stairwell.
- Vents need to be installed in the storage units at 7 Acres in order to give proper ventilation to the gas tanks and grills during warm weather.
- ➤ Vandalism at the cemetery was reported; the police were notified.
- A unanimous decision was made to donate \$100 to the *South River Fire Department*.
- Council will forego its usual meeting agenda in June to focus on stewardship within the parish, especially projects that need to be completed.
