CHURCH PRACTICES Upon entering the church, Orthodox Christians **light a candle** before an icon as a reminder of Christ's words from the Sermon on the Mount: "You are the light of the world...Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father Who is in heaven." (Matt 5:14, 16) In our parish, we place candles on the stands in front of the iconostasis, next to the tetrapods and before the Golgotha. When you light a candle, you should do so either from an existing candle (not from the votive) or by lighting a taper from the votive and igniting your candle from that.

PASTORAL CARE VISITS Because of the *Right to Privacy Laws*, Fr. David is not notified of parishioners who are hospitalized, homebound or have entered a health care facility.
