2012 CHURCH CLEANING SCHEDULE Starting January 1, the general maintenance of the church (vacuuming, removing candles/wax, dusting, etc.) will no longer be handled by the Council or a few willing parishioners and Altar Boys; it will be the responsibility of everyone on a monthly basis. So far, three "teams," comprised of families and/or individuals, have stepped up to clean the church in January, February and July, respectively. We are hoping that nine more groups will voluntarily assemble to cover the remaining months of the year, before parishioners are assigned. All supplies will be provided and a list of duties will be posted at the Candle Desk. The team members can decide among themselves when and how to handle all the required tasks. We recommend, however, that everything be completed after Liturgy on Sunday to ensure that the church is clean prior to the next service; this will also make it easier for those without access to the building to perform their duties while someone is around to unlock/lock the doors. Please be open-minded about this new procedure; it is done successfully in other parishes and it can be done so here, as well.

The Nativity Fast (Advent) is a time of preparation for the Incarnation of our Savior that is to be observed through abstinence, prayer, worship, meditation, contemplation and repentance. Unfortunately, the world sees this Lenten season as a 40-day party—"tis the season to be jolly"—and the Christmas Feast itself as the end of the celebration instead of its beginning! It seems that salvation has come to us not through Christ's birth, but through shopping, gift-giving, dinners, family and friends.
