**Lenten Youth Sunday**, a day our parish will celebrate all its young people, will be on the **Feast of the Annunciation, March 25**. The youth will be involved in many parts of the Liturgy, including reading of the Hours and Epistles, holding the Communion cloth, working the Candle Desk, ringing the bells and collecting the weekly offering. Please be sure to attend.

As is customary in our parish during the season of Great Lent, the **Sacrament of Holy Unction** will be celebrated on **Thursday**, **April 5**, at 7 p.m. In a time when the world presents us with all manner of alternative therapies, self-help books and new-age healing techniques, it is so important for us to remind ourselves that it is Christ Who heals us and redeems fallen creation with its suffering and pain. We must turn to Him for the healing of both our souls and bodies. Therefore, anyone whose physical, emotional or spiritual health is seriously impaired is encouraged to attend. (*NOTE: Because Unction is intrinsically bound to the physical and spiritual healing that we receive in the life of the Church, we must approach this sacrament as we would Communion and seek to free ourselves of the sins that separate us from the fullness of life in Jesus Christ. Therefore, it is proper for those who are not regular communicants to be absolved of their sins through Confession before being anointed. If you have any questions, contact Fr. David.)* 

An Easter Egg Hunt, hosted by the Saint Anne's Guild, will be held on the church lawn (weather permitting) on Bright Monday, April 16, following the Paschal Divine Liturgy. Children of all ages are encouraged to take part. Afterwards, there will be a Paschal Potluck Luncheon to which EVERYONE is invited.

**STEWARDSHIP: TIME & TREASURE** Attendance at Liturgy last Sunday was 137.

**HOLY CONFESSION** is sacred and necessary for your spiritual life and growth as an Orthodox Christian, especially during this penitential period of Great Lent. If you have not already done so, plan to participate in this sacrament **as soon as possible**. Check the *Liturgical & Study Week Ahead* in the weekly bulletin to find the time that is best for you. Since this act of reconciliation should be done in a prayerful and non-rushed manner, you may want to consider fulfilling this obligation after the service on Friday evenings or Saturday afternoons before Vespers. If you come at the last minute before a service starts, particularly one at which Holy Communion is given, there may not be time for Fr. David to hear your confession, which means you would have to do it afterwards. Above all, please **DO NOT** wait until Holy Week!

In addition, they must also be regular participants in the sacramental life of the church and demonstrate proper stewardship and support of the parish. The applicant must be enrolled as a full-time, undergraduate student in a two-year, four-year or certificate granting institution and have high school and/or college grade point averages of 2.25 or better.
