Church School Classes will meet TODAY following the Liturgy Dismissal.

TODAY is our **Annual Lenten Youth Sunday**, a day our parish celebrates all its young people. What a joy it was to appreciate all the gifts and blessings they bring to us!

Our intern priest, **Father Gerasim Eliel**, will continue his four-week series entitled **Scripture 101: An Intro to the Bible TODAY** during Coffee Hour. Join him this Lent as we journey together as a community of Scripture readers.

As is customary in our parish during the season of Great Lent, the **Sacrament of Holy Unction** will be celebrated on **Thursday**, **April 5**, at 7 p.m. In a time when the world presents us with all manner of alternative therapies, self-help books and new-age healing techniques, it is so important for us to remind ourselves that it is Christ Who heals us and redeems fallen creation with its suffering and pain. We must turn to Him for the healing of both our souls and bodies. Therefore, anyone whose physical, emotional or spiritual health is seriously impaired is encouraged to attend. (<u>NOTE</u>: Because Unction is intrinsically bound to the physical and spiritual healing that we receive in the life of the Church, we must approach this sacrament as we would Communion and seek to free ourselves of the sins that separate us from the fullness of life in Jesus Christ. Therefore, it is proper for those who are not regular communicants to be absolved of their sins through Holy Confession before being anointed. If you have any questions, contact Fr. David.)

An **Easter Egg Hunt**, hosted by the **Saint Anne's Guild**, will be held on the church lawn (weather permitting) on **Bright Monday**, **April 16**, following the Paschal Divine Liturgy. Children of **all ages** are encouraged to take part. Afterwards, there will be a **Paschal Potluck Luncheon** to which **EVERYONE** is invited.

HOLY CONFESSION is sacred and necessary for your spiritual life and growth as an Orthodox Christian, especially during this penitential period of Great Lent. If you have not already done so, plan to participate in this sacrament **as soon as possible**. Check the *Liturgical & Study Week Ahead* in the weekly bulletin to find the time that is best for you. Since this act of reconciliation should be done in both a prayerful and non-rushed manner, you may want to consider fulfilling this obligation after the service on Friday evenings or Saturday afternoons before Vespers. If you come at the last minute before a service starts, particularly one at which Holy Communion is given, there may not be time for Father David to hear your confession, which means you would have to do it afterwards. Above all, please **DO NOT** wait until Holy Week!

SCHEMICK-TOLLS SCHOLARSHIP Application packets are now available from Carol Deerson, Scholarship Coordinator. They must be completed and submitted by **Tuesday**, **May 1**. (All supplemental materials, such as letters of reference and transcripts, are due by **Monday**, **May 28**.) To qualify, an applicant and his/her family must be church members in good standing for at least two years prior to May 1. In addition, they must also be regular participants in the sacramental life of the church and demonstrate proper stewardship and support of the parish. The applicant must be enrolled as a full-time, undergraduate student in a two-year, four-year or certificate granting institution and have high school and/or college grade point averages of 2.25 or better. MEMORY ETERNAL After a lengthy illness, the primate of the Coptic Orthodox Church, **Pope SHENOUDA III**, fell asleep in the Lord on Memorial Saturday, March 17. Since his election in November 1971, His Holiness presided over a worldwide expansion of the Coptic Church, due primarily to emigration. He appointed the first Coptic bishops to serve in North America, Australia and South America. In his native Egypt, he faced turbulent times and, at one point, was placed under house arrest in a monastery. Throughout the many trials and tribulations he endured, he was known as a man of prayer and asceticism. We offer our deepest sympathy to all the bishops, priests, monastics and laity of the Coptic Orthodox Church and pray that God will comfort them in the days ahead—Vechnaya Pamyat!
