As is customary in our parish during the season of Great Lent, the **Sacrament of Holy Unction** will be celebrated **this Thursday, April 5**, at 7 p.m. In a time when the world presents us with all manner of alternative therapies, self-help books and new-age healing techniques, it is so important for us to remind ourselves that it is Christ Who heals us and redeems fallen creation with its suffering and pain. We must turn to Him for the healing of both our souls and bodies. Therefore, anyone whose physical, emotional or spiritual health is seriously impaired is strongly encouraged to attend. (*NOTE:* Because Holy Unction is intrinsically bound to the physical and spiritual healing that we receive in the life of the Church, we must approach this sacrament as we would Communion and seek to free ourselves of the sins that separate us from the fullness of life in Jesus Christ. Therefore, it is proper for those who are not regular communicants to be absolved of their sins through Holy Confession before being anointed. If you have any questions, get in touch with Fr. David.)

HOLY CONFESSION We are now entering the sixth and final week of Great Lent. If you have not yet gone to Confession, **PLEASE** do not let it go until the 11th hour when time is a factor. There are plenty of opportunities this week to complete this act of reconciliation: before the Liturgy of Presanctified Gifts and the Sacrament of Unction on Wednesday and Thursday, respectively; before and after Great Compline/Matins on Friday evening; before Divine Liturgy on Saturday morning; and before and after Vigil on Saturday evening; check the *Liturgical & Study Week Ahead* in the weekly bulletin to find the time that is best for you. Above all, **DO NOT** wait until Holy Week! (*NOTE:* For those who are more comfortable making a confession in Russian, our Pastor Emeritus, Fr. Sergius Kuharsky, will be in church this Wednesday, April 4, starting at 6 p.m. Inform your friends or relatives. If someone is unavailable on this day, he/she should contact Fr. David so that other arrangements can be made.)

ALL-NIGHT VIGIL Our church will remain **open** for prayer, reflection and meditation from Holy Friday afternoon until the beginning of Nocturne on Holy Saturday night. Volunteers **of all ages** are needed to be on *grave watch* for two-hour shifts to keep vigil at the Tomb of Our Lord by reading the Psalms and Acts of the Apostles. Everyone is encouraged to participate in this symbolic act representing the guards who were posted by Pontius Pilate to stand watch over the Holy Sepulchre; it is a wonderfully quiet and prayerful opportunity. CHURCH ETIQUETTE Please **DO NOT** chew gum in the church; not only is it disrespectful, distracting and sometimes noisy, it is considered "breaking the fast" for anyone desiring to partake of Holy Communion. Your strict attention to this matter of etiquette is greatly appreciated.

They must also be regular participants in the sacramental life of the church and demonstrate proper stewardship and support of the parish. The applicant must be enrolled as a full-time, undergraduate student in a two-year, four-year or certificate granting institution and have high school and/or college grade point averages of 2.25 or better.
