**Provodnoye**, the Annual Easter Cemetery Visitation, will take place, weather permitting, **TODAY**. Rebecca Kozak and James Kornafel will be at the Central Cross, starting at **12 noon**, with forms for writing the first names of those buried at the cemetery. At 1 p.m., Father David, along with our intern priest, Father Gerasim Eliel, and the Church Choir, will celebrate the *Paschal Panihida* commemorating all the deceased people listed. Following the service, Frs. David and Gerasim will bless each plot with Holy Water. After all graves are blessed, Fr. David will then bless any new monuments, upon request. If the weather should prevent the visitation on this day, it will take place **next Sunday**, **April 29**, at 1 p.m.

A New Jersey Deanery Meeting will be hosted by our parish on Monday, April 23. Liturgy with His Grace, Bishop MICHAEL, will be celebrated at 10 a.m. All parishioners are invited to attend the service.

STEWARDSHIP: TIME & TREASURE Attendance at the Paschal Services last Sunday: Nocturne/Matins, 215; Liturgy, 191.

**MINISTRY DUTIES** The Epistle will be read next Sunday by **Subdeacon Paul Machyowsky**. Coffee Hour will be hosted by the **Men's Club**. The church will be cleaned by **Team Silowka**. (<u>NOTE</u>: The Senior R Club will be responsible for Coffee Hour during the month of May.)

**CONFESSION AND COMMUNION DURING THE PASCHAL SEASON** As is our practice during these most glorious days of the Holy Resurrection, there will be **NO General Confession** until the **Eve of Pentecost, June 2**. Those of you who confessed during Great Lent and communed on Pascha may continue to approach the Holy Chalice on Sundays and holidays, provided that you prepare accordingly (prayer and meditation) and fast from food and drink after midnight. Remember that if you miss one Sunday, you must go to private Confession or at least speak with Fr. David before communing the next time. (<u>NOTE</u>: For those in need of Confession, Father will be available, as usual, on Saturday afternoons, starting at 5 p.m.)

According to the **Typikon** (Rites of the Holy Church), one should **NOT KNEEL** in prayer, either at home or in church, during the Paschal season until the Vespers of Pentecost on June 3. Also, until the Leavetaking of Pascha on May 23, **"O Heavenly King..."** should be replaced by **"Christ is Risen..."** in one's daily prayers.
