MINISTRY DUTIES The Epistle will be read next week by **John Kozak**. Because of the "Taste of the Parish," there will be **NO COFFEE HOUR**. The church will be cleaned by **Team Kelly**. (<u>NOTE</u>: The **Parish Council** will be responsible for Coffee Hour throughout the remainder of June.)

GENERAL CONFESSION will resume **this Saturday**, **June 2**, following Great Vespers. This *Rite of Forgiveness* is held on the **first** and **third Saturdays** of the month. (*Refer to The Liturgical & Study Week Ahead* for any changes.) Those of you who regularly commune can participate on whichever weekend is more convenient. Note that you are **NOT** required to go twice a month—only once—and if you desire a private confession before then, Father David will be available, as usual, on Saturday afternoons, starting at 5 p.m. Remember that General Confession is **NOT** a replacement for personal Confession; it is used to help you better prepare and profess your sins and shortcomings during those times when you participate privately in the Mystery of Holy Repentance. In the words of Protopresbyter Alexander Schmemann: "General Confession is, first of all, a certain school of repentance, the revealing of the very essence of confession...a way to a common growth in the spirit of repentance."

THE NEWLY DEPARTED On Monday, May 21, the Feast of SS. Constantine & Helen, **His Eminence**, **Metropolitan CONSTANTINE**, Primate of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church (UOC) of the USA, fell asleep in the Lord, one day after celebrating the 40th anniversary of his blessed archpastoral ministry. His Eminence was the first American-born Ukrainian Orthodox bishop and a champion of full Orthodox unity, bringing his church into the jurisdictional fold of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople and overseeing unification with other Ukrainian Orthodox jurisdictions. He was not only a kind, outgoing and gentle man, but a strong defender of the Faith. He also loved children, making ministry to youth and young adults a priority. We extend our sincere sympathy to his family and his beloved spiritual flock, the clergy and faithful of the UOC of the USA, South America and Europe. His shepherding days are over...now the Chief Shepherd rewards the servant. Memory Eternal—Vechnaya Pamyat!

During this post-festal period of the Ascension, there is still **NO** kneeling in prayer, either at home or in church.

A reminder that the Feast of Holy Pentecost is **next Sunday**. There are several beautiful customs associated with this holiday, known by many as **Green Sunday**. The vestments and the altar covers are changed to green and even green boughs are brought into the church for decoration. Branches are also placed on all the outside banisters and doors of the church and people hang a green branch over the entrance of their homes. It is also customary for those present at the liturgical services throughout the week to wear green clothing. Why? Because green is the color of spring and summer, the color of life, and life is an attribute of the Holy Spirit, "**the Lord and Giver of Life**" Who animates all. You are, therefore, encouraged to welcome the Holy Spirit, both inwardly and outwardly, by participating in these traditions.

Also, next Sunday, immediately following Divine Liturgy, the **Vespers of Pentecost** will be served with special prayers asking help from the All-holy Trinity in our efforts towards salvation. **Kneeling**, which has been absent since Pascha, will be reincorporated into our worship during this service. We will also hear, once again, **"O Heavenly King..."** and **"We have seen the True Light..."** This is a **GREAT** feast of the Church; please make attendance a priority.


