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The Apostles Fast begins tomorrow and ends on June 29, the Feast SS. Peter & Paul. The ancient Apostolic Constitution, dating back to the 4<sup>th</sup> century, gives us insight into this solemn period of prayer and abstinence: "After the Feast of Pentecost, celebrate one week, then observe a fast, for justice demands rejoicing after the reception of the gifts of God and fasting after the body has been refreshed."

Many people choose to ignore this season of preparation. It is wrong to do so, for as with all the fasts of the Church, this time has been given to us to re-examine our lives, focusing less on the "pleasures of the flesh" and more on the beauty and joy of spiritual things, like prayer and repentance.

The Apostles almost always fasted. Since we have them as exemplars and teachers of the Faith, shouldn't we do the same? Take advantage, therefore, of these days ahead by becoming more open to the Lord's will and action in your life. Only then will the upcoming feast of our parish patrons be truly meaningful and joyous.

Dear Fellow Parishioners:

Get ready...get set...go...for the 17<sup>th</sup> Annual Run/Walk for the Church to be held on Saturday, June 23. With beautiful weather and everyone enjoying a wonderful time, last year's experience was more fun than I could have planned and this year promises to be the same. I welcome your participation in an event that not only raises funds, but provides the opportunity to socialize with Orthodox brothers and sisters outside of worship services.
